Jesus, who stands in the ranks of sinful people and wants to be baptized of conversion at the hands of John the Baptist, reveals himself to the world as the beloved Son of God, marked by the power of the Holy Spirit who comes to reveal God to the world. This Sunday ends the Christmas season.

THE MASSES & DEVOTIONS THROUGH THE PARISH TV

DESPITE YOUR ABSENCE...

Despite churches closed for public Masses, we are with you and we feel your presence in the church. During this time of great trial of our faith, we invite you every day to our church for the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament to pray for the end of the pandemic, which takes place from 3pm to 6pm from Monday to Saturday. However, you have to sign up for a free time segment, and we must remember that only 10 people can be in the church. If we see that there are 10 people, we have to wait or come later.

We invite you to participate in Masses and devotions from our church Online, www.kazimierz.org - Parish TV. Holy Masses are celebrated every day, on Sundays, according to the regular schedule in our parish. Stay with us.

The pandemic is also having a great negative impact on the financial health of our parish. Sunday offerings in March-November fell by 40% compared to 2019. In June, only half of the faithful returned to the church and the burden of supporting the parish was mostly on their shoulders, with only 10% of those who stayed at home and participated in Masses through parish TV; they

felt responsible for their parish and sent Sunday offerings, or they brought them to the mailbox. <u>Therefore, we ask everyone to</u> remember and support their parish in these difficult times. <u>Offerings can be brought to the parish office, thrown into a</u> <u>letterbox, or mailed. It is also possible to make a donation by credit</u> <u>card on our website by using the link: Online Donation and then</u> <u>selecting our parish.</u>

STUDY DAYS

Next week our pastoral team will be participating in their annual STUDY DAYS from January 11th to January 15th. The parish office will be open according to the usual schedule; **there will be no Masses that week.** The Oblate Fathers ask all parishioners for prayers in their intention.

YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

With the Apostolic Letter "*Patris corde*" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception from December 8, 2020 to extending to the same feast in 2021, December 8, 2021.

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled "Patris corde", Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved, tender and loving father; an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. In his letter, Pope Francis notes how, "Every day, for over forty years, following Lauds [Morning Prayer]" he has "recited a prayer to Saint Joseph taken from a nineteenth-century French prayer book of the Congregation of the Sisters of Jesus and Mary." This prayer, he says, expresses devotion and trust, and even poses a certain challenge to Saint Joseph," on account of its closing words: "My beloved father, all my trust is in you. Let it not be said that I invoked you in vain, and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary, show me that your goodness is as great as your power." The Apostolic Penitentiary also issued a decree granting special indulgences for the duration of the special year to celebrate the anniversary and "to perpetuate the entrustment of the whole Church to the powerful patronage of the Custodian of Jesus." During this period, the faithful will have the opportunity to commit themselves "with prayer and good works, to obtain, with the help of St. Joseph, head of the heavenly Family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from the serious human and social tribulations that besiege the contemporary world today." Amid the ongoing Covid-19 health crisis, the gift of the plenary indulgence is also extended to the sick, the elderly, the dying and all those who for legitimate reasons are unable to leave their homes. They too can obtain the plenary indulgences if they are detached from any sin and have the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the three usual conditions and recite an act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, offering to God the pains and hardships of their lives.

PRAYER TO ST. JOSEPH

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you, Mary placed her trust; with you, Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILATION AND HOLY COMMUNION

In these special circumstances, we invite you not to be afraid of taking advantage of the sacrament of penance and reconciliation, because we all need to draw from the infinite source of God's Mercy!

Currently, confession takes place every Sunday from 4 p.m. to 5 p.m. in the parish hall.

We encourage you to take advantage of the reception of Jesus in Holy Communion at a time when we cannot attend the Holy Mass. <u>Holy Communion is available every Sunday from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.</u> in the church.
