THE MASSES & DEVOTIONS THROUGH THE PARISH TV

DESPITE YOUR ABSENCE...

Despite churches closed for public Masses, we are with you and we feel your presence in the church. During this time of great trial of our faith, we invite you every day to our church for the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament to pray for the end of the pandemic, which takes place from 3pm to 6pm from Monday to Saturday. However, you have to sign up for a free time segment, and we must remember that only 10 people can be in the church. If we see that there are 10 people, we have to wait or come later.

We invite you to participate in Masses and devotions from our church Online, www.kazimierz.org - Parish TV. Holy Masses are celebrated every day, on Sundays, according to the regular schedule in our parish. Stay with us.

The pandemic is also having a great negative impact on the financial health of our parish. Sunday offerings in March-November fell by 40% compared to 2019. In June, only half of the faithful returned to the church and the burden of supporting the parish was mostly on their shoulders, with only 10% of those who stayed at home and participated in Masses through parish TV; they felt responsible for their parish and sent Sunday offerings, or they brought them to the mailbox. Therefore, we ask everyone to remember and support their parish in these difficult times. Offerings can be brought to the parish office, thrown into a letterbox, or mailed. It is also possible to make a donation by credit card on our website by using the link: Online Donation and then selecting our parish.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

It is the Week of Universal Prayer for Christian Unity. We cannot limit ourselves to prayer, but under its influence, we should change our behavior. Let us remember the words of the Lord Jesus: "I have given them a glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one. I in them and you in me." (John 17:22, 23).

THE FEAT OF THE CONVERTION OF ST. PAUL

Tomorrow is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, the apostle of Jesus. A zealous Pharisee and persecutor of the early Church, after the risen Christ appeared to him, he became his disciple and devoted the rest of his life to spreading the Gospel. NOVENA TO ST. JOSEPH

We continue to pray the Novena to St. Joseph on the Year of St. Joseph every Wednesday. We will pray through the intercession of St. Joseph and ask for the graces needed to the Holy Church and us. The novena will end on March 19th, the Feast of St. Joseph, husband of Mary. In the various sufferings and experiences of this life, the intercession of the saints is a great consolation for us. They also went through the same vicissitudes of earthly life and experienced our misery themselves; they take pity on us and support us in heaven with their prayers. We should give Saint Joseph, after the Holy Mother, our special honor. He remained in the closest relationship with the Savior, after the Blessed Virgin, he was elevated to the highest dignity, becoming the Guardian and foster Father of the Child, and his virtues and extraordinary sanctity of life won him the Heart of Jesus and a special grace from God. Continued experience shows how effective the care of Saint Joseph is. No wonder, then, that the devotion to Saint Joseph is increasing and spreading more and more, and the Holy Church, encountering numerous obstacles in its activities, suffering in many countries oppression from the enemies of Christ's Name, constantly calls for protection not only of Mary, but also of the protection of Saint Joseph.
