MEMORIAL OF ST. VALENTINE

February 14 - MEMORIAL of ST. Valentine's Day is an occasion to thank God for the love he gives us, for those who love us and for whom we have strong feelings. It is also an opportunity to ask the Creator through the intercession of St. Valentine for help in choosing a life partner. Let us also remember that through St. Valentine you can ask for help and intercession for all psychiatric illnesses.

THE PASTOR REFLECTION FOR LENT

This Wednesday we are starting the holy and beneficial Lenten season. The external sign of our entering the path of penance and conversion will be to sprinkle ashes on our heads and to take up various forms of mortification. Ashes reminds us that everything earthly came into being from the dust of the earth and will turn to dust again. Lent is a time of penance, fasting, sacrifice, prayer and conversion, to prepare our hearts for a fruitful experience of the joyful celebrations of the Lord's Resurrection. The Church commandment obliges us, during the Lenten Penance, to refrain from participating in dances and to go to confession and receive Holy Communion on Easter. We encourage everyone to make an inward commitment to renounce Christ. What will you give up for

Lent? Maybe cigarettes, alcohol, time on internet, or maybe you decide to be better, kinder. Alternatively, maybe you give up sweets, gossip, watching TV. Choose one thing for you to know that you are going through Lent. Make it for crucified Christ.

LENT – A TIME OF GRACE

Wednesday, February 17, we will begin the period of Lent, which is the time preceding the greatest and most important Christian holidays - the Lord's Resurrection. Let us use this time as best as possible, because it is a time of special grace. No matter what the limitations of the virus will be, let us try to experience this Lent, even more consciously and be fully committed to ourselves. Lent covers forty days from Ash Wednesday to the beginning of the liturgy of Holy Thursday; Sundays are not included in these forty days. Certain traditions are associated with the period of Lent like sprinkling ashes on heads of the faithful as a sign of the beginning of penance and fasting; religious services, such as: Way of the Cross or Lamentations; the custom of making a retreat; works of mercy e.g. alms. The ceremony of sprinkling the heads with ashes was introduced into the church liturgy around the 6th century.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday, February 17th, marks the beginning of the Lenten Season in the Catholic Church. It is a day on which we bow our heads humbly before God and begin our 40-day preparation to celebrate the Paschal Mystery. On that day, Catholics are obliged to fast (at most eating one full meal and two light meals) and abstain from meat. Masses on Ash Wednesday will be celebrated in Polish at 8:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. via Parish TV. The offering envelopes are in the Sunday Offerings Envelopes and at the back of the church.

The liturgy of sprinkling the heads with ashes will take place between 9am and 10am, 12pm and 1pm and 4pm and 6pm in the church. Please remember that only 10 people can enter the church. There will be no Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament that day.

LENTEN LAMENTATION & WAY OF THE CROSS

We invite everyone to our traditional Polish Lenten devotions: the Lenten Lamentations will be held every Sunday at 6:15 p.m. and the Way of the Cross-every Friday at 6:30 p.m. follow by the Mass at 7:00 p.m. in Polish. Christians, who devoutly participate in the Way of the Cross, are granted a plenary indulgence.
