DESPITE YOUR ABSENCE...

Despite churches closed for public Masses, we are with you and we feel your presence in the church. During this time of great trial of our faith, we invite you every day to our church for the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament to pray for the end of the pandemic, which takes place from 3pm to 6pm from Monday to Saturday. However, you have to sign up for a free time segment, and we must remember that only 10 people can be in the church. If we see that there are 10 people, we have to wait or come later.

We invite you to participate in Masses and devotions from our church Online, www.kazimierz.org - Parish TV. Holy Masses are celebrated every day, on Sundays, according to the regular schedule in our parish. Stay with us.

The pandemic is also having a great negative impact on the financial health of our parish. Sunday offerings in March-November fell by 40% compared to 2019. In June, only half of the faithful returned to the church and the burden of supporting the parish was mostly on their shoulders, with only 10% of those who stayed at home and participated in Masses through parish TV; they felt responsible for their parish and sent Sunday offerings, or they brought them to the mailbox. Therefore, we ask everyone to remember and support their parish in these difficult times. Offerings can be brought to the parish office, thrown into a letterbox, or mailed. It is also possible to make a donation by credit

card on our website by using the link: Online Donation and then selecting our parish.

COLLECTION FOR THE WORKS OF THE OBLATE MISSIONS

In recent years, our Fathers went to the new mission stations in Vietnam, Africa, Belarus, Ukraine and Russia; in many cases, there has been a need to build everything from scratch (in both the spiritual and material). WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

February 11th, the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, the Church celebrates the annual World Day of the Sick, which was established by Pope John Paul II, May 13, 1992, on the 11th anniversary of the assassination attempt on his life, and at the same time on the 75th anniversary of the Fatima apparitions. This day is always celebrated on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, famous for many healings. That day we embrace our sick with the prayers. Mary appeared to the poor shepherd Bernardette Soubirous in 1858 in Lourdes, France, at the Masabel's Grotto, four years after Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. During eighteen apparitions (February 11 - July 16, 1858), Mary called for prayer and penance. The content of the message of Mary of Lourdes is the call of sinners to conversion and the whole Church to prayer and penance. Lourdes has become a place that radiates a spirit of love throughout the world, especially towards the sick and the poor. The faithful ask for many favors there thanks to the intercession of the Holy Mother.

LENT – TIME OF GRACE

In a few days, exactly next Wednesday, February 17, we will begin the period of Lent, which is the time preceding the greatest and most important Christian holidays - the Lord's Resurrection. Let us use this time as best as possible, because it is a time of special grace. No matter what the limitations of the virus will be, let us try to experience this Lent, even more consciously and be fully committed to ourselves. Lent covers forty days from Ash Wednesday to the beginning of the liturgy of Holy Thursday; Sundays are not included in these forty days. Certain traditions are associated with the period of Lent like sprinkling ashes on heads of the faithful as a sign of the beginning of penance and fasting; religious services, such as: Way of the Cross or Lamentations; the custom of making a retreat; works of mercy e.g. alms. No matter what the sanitary restrictions are due to the virus, the ashes rite is sure to take place, and details we will announced next weekend. The ceremony of sprinkling the heads with ashes was introduced into the church liturgy around the 6th century.

NOVENA TO ST. JOSEPH

We continue to pray the Novena to St. Joseph on the Year of St. Joseph every Wednesday. We will pray through the intercession of St. Joseph and ask for the graces needed to the Holy Church and us. The novena will end before March 19th, the Feast of St. Joseph, husband of Mary.

PRAYER TO ST. JOSEPH

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you, Mary placed her trust; with you, Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.
