THE PASTOR'S REFLECTION

The last Sunday of October in the liturgical calendar is celebrated as the anniversary of the dedication of our parish church, that is, the dedication of the church as the exclusive property of the Lord God. Today we give thanks for our parish cenacle, where we gather for prayer, liturgy, and the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice and other sacraments. Here we strengthen our communion with God and our brothers and sisters. Today's thanksgiving also brings with it a commitment that we, as a community, properly care for this place of God's special presence.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY

This Sunday throughout the Church is dedicated to missions. Missionary Week begins. We pray for missions and for missionaries, both religious and lay. We pray that they may effectively fulfill their vocation and bring the Gospel to peoples and nations who have lost faith or have not yet come to know God. This is an opportune time to remind ourselves that the missionary vocation is at the heart of the Church's life. World Mission Day also reminds us how diverse the Church is, and therefore truly universal. It is a mosaic of cultures, races, languages, and customs. We support this great missionary endeavor in various ways, including today by making an offering to the Pontifical Mission Societies. The second collection, collected after Holy Communion, is intended for the Pontifical Mission Societies.

HOLY APOSTLES SIMON & JUDE THADDEUS

On Tuesday, in the liturgy, we honor the Holy Apostles Simon and Jude Thaddeus. Gazing upon their witness, we will pray to God for strong faith. Saint Jude Thaddeus is considered the patron saint of hopeless cases; we invoke him in times of special need.

On October 31 (Friday), after the evening Mass, there will be a Vigil with the Saints led by the youth.

ALL SAINTS' DAY

Saturday, November 1, is All Saints' Day. We should attend Mass on this day. In our church, Masses will be at 7:00 PM on Friday and at 8:00 AM and 11:00 AM on Saturday. Evening Mass now liturgically belongs to All Souls' Day. On November 1, we praise God in His saints—those who lived faithfully to God and His commandments. For us, they are signposts on the path to eternity.

ALL SOULS' DAY

Next Sunday, November 2, we commemorate All the Faithful Departed in the liturgy, known as All Souls' Day. Let us also remember that during the first eight days of November, we can offer the souls in purgatory a great gift – a plenary indulgence for devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for their intentions, as well as fulfilling the other usual conditions: being in a state of sanctifying grace, not being attached to any sin, receiving Holy Communion, and praying for the intentions designated by the Pope.

CATECHESIS 2025-2026

Catechesis in our parish for the 2025-2026 school year have already started and take place on Saturdays from 12:15 PM to 1:45 PM after Polish School classes in the classrooms of St. Casimir's Polish School. Children from kindergarten to grade 7 will be catechized. Registration forms are available at the parish office or on our website www.kazimierz.org (tab: About the parish/Forms to download). Preparation for First Communion will be conducted in Polish and English, while preparation for Confirmation will be conducted in English only. Parents who register their children for the sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation are asked to attach a copy of a child baptism certificate if was outside the St. Casimir's Parish.

NOVEMBER – THE MONTH OF PRAYARS FOR FAITHFUL DEPARTED

The Church prays for all the deceased, especially in November. This is a month of prayerful solidarity between the living and those in purgatory. They need the prayers of the living to shorten their penance and unite with God in heaven. After death, souls can no longer do anything for themselves and therefore need the prayers of the living. One form of assistance is the "memorials." We

remind you that in November, 15 Masses are celebrated in our parish and 30 at the Provincial House for the intentions mentioned in the "memorials." Envelopes for the "memorials" are located at every church entrance and in the annual collections. The "memorials" should be placed in the collection box at the altar of Our Lady.
