### THE PASTOR'S REFLECTION

The penultimate liturgy of the word concluding the liturgical church year, first introduced by the prophet Malachi, introduces us to a somewhat terrifying atmosphere, as in the first reading we hear the announcement of God's judgment, which will be as fiery as an oven. However, those who honor the name of the Lord have no reason to fear. Jesus' words, recorded by Saint Luke in today's Gospel, are also full of warnings. Christ warns us against deceivers and foretells dramatic scenes of the end, with earthquakes and famine. However, we find comfort and hope in the verse that concludes this pericope, for here we encounter the promise: not a hair of our head will perish, God will be with us, and we will gain salvation through perseverance.

## WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

This Sunday is celebrated in the universal Church as World Day of the Poor. Pope Francis established this day in November 2016 with a special Apostolic Letter, "Misericordia et Misera", written at the conclusion of the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. Let us open our hearts to every human misery and willingly engage in the work of social and church organizations, such as ShareLife, assistance to Polish missionaries in Cuba, or our donation for packages for children in orphanages.

## THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

On Friday, November 21, we commemorate the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the liturgy. When Mary was three years old, her parents, Saint Joachim and Saint Anne, entrusted her to the priest Zacharias, father of Saint John the

Baptist, for upbringing and education. Mary remained in the temple for approximately 12 years. To commemorate this mystery of her life, a special feast has been celebrated since the 8<sup>th</sup> century in the East, and since the 14<sup>th</sup> century in the West.

## SAINT CECILIA, VIRGIN AND MARTYR

On Saturday, November 22, in the liturgy we commemorate St. Cecilia, virgin and martyr, patron saint of choristers, luthiers, musicians, organists, and church vocal and musical ensembles.

#### THE END OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR

We are approaching the end of the liturgical year. Next Sunday, November 23rd, is the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, the last Sunday before Advent.

The devotion to Our Lady of Perpetual Help will begin at 6:30 p.m. The devotion to Divine Mercy will be celebrated on Friday at 6:30 p.m.

### THE ADVENT RETREAT IN POLISH

The Advent retreat in our parish will be held from November 30 to December 2, at the very beginning of Advent. The retreat will be preached by Fr. Anton Litvinov, OMI, from Turkmenistan. Anton Litvinov was born on September 26, 1989, in Turkmenistan on the shores of the Caspian Sea to a family of Polish descent. As he says of himself, "My story of faith and vocation is the fruit of the proclamation of the Word of God by the Missionary Oblates." He was baptized on Easter Eve, March 27, 2005. A year later, he was accepted into the Missionary Oblates' postulancy in Ukraine, where he also studied philosophy. He completed his novitiate and theological studies at the seminary in Obra. After ordination as a deacon, he was assigned to missionary service in Ukraine. After a year of pastoral internship in Kyiv, he was ordained a priest on May 7, 2016. He received the sacrament of Holy Orders from Bishop Radosław Zmitrowicz, OMI, at St. Nicholas Church in Kyiv. He has been preaching the Word of God in Ukraine for ten years. Within the delegation, he is responsible for vocations, altar servers, youth, and Friends of the Mission in Ukraine.
