THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

How can we discover the mysteries of God's Revelation? The first reading, which cries out: "Arise! Shine!", will guide us. The Lord who comes is the source of light. Therefore, the early Christians saw in the rising sun a symbol of Christ, who comes to dispel the darkness of night and the doubts of faith. The prophet Isaiah foretells the countless multitudes who will be enlightened by the coming of the Messiah. In his Letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul reminds us that God enlightened the hearts of the Gentiles with his grace, giving them access to his mysteries. In this way, each of us carries within us a part of Christ. The immense courage of the Magi from the East foretells the coming of all humanity to Christ. In Him, to this day, they recognize the announced Savior who enlightens hearts. Enlightened by power from on high, let us listen to the word of God.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

As we recall the baptism of the Lord Jesus in the Jordan, we also think of our own baptism, which is the beginning and foundation of our Christian life—our friendship and communion with God. In this sacrament, we have received the dignity of adopted children of God and the gift of God's love. We have also been incorporated into the community of the Church. Receiving baptism also represents a great obligation for us. We must follow the path of becoming increasingly like Christ, that is, loving Him more and more and learning from Him how to love our neighbors.

DEVOTION TO OUR LADY OF FATIMA

On Tuesday, January 13, at 6:00 PM, we invite you to the Fatima Devotion, which has its roots in the apparitions of Our Lady in Fatima in 1917 and is intended to atone to Her Immaculate Heart for the offenses committed by people. During the apparitions, Our Lady asked for the prayer of the rosary and reparation for the sins of the

world. Mary promised salvation to those who practice it with faith. Through this devotion, we can contribute to saving many people from the damnation and wars and other civilizational catastrophes announced by the Blessed Mother.

Thank you from Cuba! Dear Father Janusz OMI and dear faithful of St. Casimir's Parish in Toronto, I would like to sincerely thank you for your support and organizing the campaign for the Oblate Missions in Cuba. Organizing such a large undertaking certainly required the involvement of many people, time, and energy. Thank you to everyone who supported this initiative and helped our mission in Cuba.

Dear all, allow me to share with you some information about the Oblate Mission in Cuba. The history of our mission does not date back centuries, as the Oblates only began their missionary work in Cuba in 1997, and it could be said that our arrival on the island is the fruit of John Paul II's pilgrimage, which took place in 1998. Currently, four Oblates (two Poles, one from Sri Lanka, and one from Mexico) work in two outposts, serving in four parishes and 11 chapels in Havana and Los Palacios.

I assume many of you have visited Cuba and are certainly familiar with the economic and social situation in the country. However, allow me to mention a few facts about the lives and daily hardships of the people we serve and among whom we live. Cuba lacks basic necessities, including bread and milk, and even sugar, of which Cuba was the world's largest producer. Electricity is out on 60% of the island for over 20 hours a day; garbage rots on city streets because there is no fuel to transport it. 90% of Cubans live in poverty.

Nothing more clearly illustrates the state of the country than the number of emigrants. Between 2023 and 2024, Cuba's population decreased by 18% from 11 million to 8.5 million. Finally, please accept the gift of Holy Mass, which I offer for your parish and for my brother Oblates who serve you, as well as my Christmas wishes. Dear friends, I wish you the peace of Christ, health, and God's blessings. May the coming new year bring you as many divine graces as possible. I wish you faith like that of Mary, who, without understanding, trusted the Word and allowed God to use her to give people happiness, and may you also share it with others. God bless you.
