THE PASTOR'S REFLECTION

How can we discover the mysteries of God's Revelation? The first reading, which cries out: "Arise! Shine!", will guide us. The Lord who comes is the source of light. Therefore, the early Christians saw in the rising sun a symbol of Christ, who comes to dispel the darkness of night and the doubts of faith. The prophet Isaiah foretells the countless multitudes who will be enlightened by the coming of the Messiah. In his Letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul reminds us that God enlightened the hearts of the Gentiles with his grace, giving them access to his mysteries. In this way, each of us carries within us a part of Christ. The immense courage of the Magi from the East foretells the coming of all humanity to Christ. In Him, to this day, they recognize the announced Savior who enlightens hearts. Enlightened by power from on high, let us listen to the word of God.

THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

The Feast of the Epiphany, traditionally known in our country as the Feast of the Three Kings, has been celebrated in the Church since the 4th century. It proclaims that the Son of God, sent by the Father into the world, revealed himself to humanity as the Savior of all creation. The homage paid to him by the Magi from the East is a sign that Christ brought salvation to the entire world. This is another unique opportunity to examine our own communion with God and others, to remind ourselves of our Christian duty to draw others to the Lord God through the personal example of authentic faith.

BLESSING OF CHALK & INCENSE

During our first Holy Mass, we blessed chalk and incense. With this chalk, in accordance with an ancient custom, we trace the first letters of the names of the Three Wise Men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar, on the doors of our homes and apartments. We wish to emphasize that, like the Wise Men from the East, we too seek Christ and rejoice in finding Him. The inscription (C + M + B 2026) also signifies a request for Christ to bless our home: "Christus mansionem benedicat" and serves as a testimony of our faith to others. Therefore, let us not abandon this beautiful Polish custom.

Today's celebration marks the end of the Jubilee Year 2025 throughout the Catholic Church. Have we benefited from the grace that this holy time has brought us?

PARISH STATISTICS

Statistics regarding our community: 1,680 families are registered in the parish register. Last year, we had 28 baptisms, 6 weddings, 52 funerals, 19 children received their First Holy Communion, 5 young people received the sacrament of confirmation, and Fathers made approximately 300 pastoral visits to the sick. Our community is large; let us take care of each other, respect each other, and above all, strive to develop the spiritual life in our families and the Polish community.

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Next Sunday, January 11, is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This Sunday concludes the liturgical season of Christmas. We will celebrate the commemoration of the public proclamation of the messianic mission of the Lord Jesus. We will also reflect on our own baptism and our call to salvation. Perhaps it is worth recalling the date and place of our baptism. Perhaps it is worth realizing that through my own baptism I became a child of God, that through holy baptism my communion with the Lord God began, to which I am to bear witness to others through my own life.

POLISH SCHOOL & CATECHISM CLASSES

We inform you that the Polish School of St. Casimir and Catechism classes will be closed for Christmas until January 3 inclusive. Students will return to regular classes on Saturday, January 10.

SOUND SYSTEM

Our current sound system in the church is over a decade old and frequently breaks down. Many parishioners, especially older parishioners, complain about our sound system. We are fully aware of the system's shortcomings and are working on modernizing it. Currently, thanks to Mr. Andrzej Peczar and Piotr Pliszka, the system works much better, but only on one track (channel), as the others are faulty.

The Finance Committee discussed this issue and decided on a thorough system upgrade. Specifically, we replaced the damaged amplifier, mixer, and processors, and added

new speakers in the church, ensuring each speaker in the church has a speaker. This solution may help eliminate reverberation and distribute sound evenly throughout the church. The upgrade will be performed by Soundbox Production, a Hamilton-based company. We have received permission from the Archdiocese of Toronto to upgrade the sound system. Work on the upgrade will begin in the New Year.
