**SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY
AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

Today's celebration touches on the topic of spiritual nourishment. In the Book of Deuteronomy, God feeds the Israelites with manna, reminding them that "man does not live by bread alone." Manna was a prefiguration of the Eucharist—the true food that gives eternal life. Origen saw manna as a symbol of Christ, who is our spiritual nourishment. In the Letter to the Corinthians, Saint Paul says that the Eucharist unites believers in unity with Christ and with one another. In the Gospel, Jesus says, "My body is true food." For Origen, these words mean that Jesus satisfies our spiritual longings. The Eucharist gives us the strength to continually walk the path of faith. Let us receive the spiritual nourishment with which God wants to nourish us on the path to eternity.

CORPUS CHRISTI

Today we praise God for the sacramental presence of the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. The words of the Lord Jesus that he will remain with us until the end of time have more than just symbolic meaning. In the Eucharist, Christ is truly and truly present with his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The most beautiful way to honor God is to participate in Holy Mass and receive Holy Communion. Let us remember that Christ wants to be present in our personal, family, professional, social, and national lives, not only on special occasions, but above all, every day.

PROCESSION OF THE CORPUS CHRISTI

Following the 11 a.m. Mass, there will be a solemn procession to the four altars. We ask the committee members to please secure the procession route. The procession will end at the fourth altar in the Credit Union parking lot. There will be no 1 p.m. Mass today.

I especially thank those who helped organize the procession: the altar boys, the Committee members, the volunteers, the Girl Scouts, and all involved. Christ the Lord calls us to acknowledge Him before others. SOLEMNITY OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

It was at the request of Polish bishops that Pope Clement XIII extended the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to the entire Church in 1765. Many still remember the practice of special consecration of families to the Sacred Heart. So many generations of good fathers and mothers, so many priestly and religious vocations, were formed in the school of the Sacred Heart of Jesus! This Heart is the source of mercy for modern man and the world. Because of the solemnity, there will be no fast from meat this coming Friday.

On Saturday, June 13, we turn to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. She continually leads us to her Son and constantly prompts us: "Do whatever my Son tells you..."

DEVOTION TO OUR LADY OF FATIMA

This Saturday, June 13, we invite you to the Fatima service at 6pm. We bring battery-powered lanterns with us, candles are not allowed in the church. Fatima services are Marian services held on the 13th day of the month. This day is not accidental, because Our Lady appeared to three shepherd children, St. Jacinta, Saints Francis and Lucia, for 6 months from May 13, 1917 to October 13, 1917, Our Lady revealed three secrets to the children (commonly called the Secrets of Fatima). She also addressed the children with a request and message: "Pray the rosary every day." "I want you to continue to pray the rosary every day in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary, to ask for peace in the world and for an end to the war, because only She can obtain these graces."

WORLD YOUTH DAY IN SOUTH KOREA

Our parish is organizing a trip to the 41st World Youth Day in Seoul, South Korea, which will take place from August 3-8, 2027. The event's theme will be "Courage! I have overcome the world!" These words are taken from Jesus' farewell discourse to his disciples in the Gospel of John. Young people interested in the trip are asked to contact Father Pawel. Over 4,000 young Poles have already declared their participation in World Youth Day in Seoul in 2027. The largest number of applications come from the two Warsaw dioceses and the Archdioceses of Krakow and Gdańsk.

POLISH ALTAR IN MIDLAND

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the Shrine of the Canadian Martyrs and the 70th anniversary of Polish pilgrimages to Midland. In 1956, to celebrate the Marian Year, the 300th anniversary of the defense of Jasna Gora, and the vows of King John, the first nationwide Polish pilgrimage to Midland was organized. Fifty-three years ago, in 1973, the Polish Altar was built thanks to donations from the Polish community. Unfortunately, the altar is completely rotten. After consultation, the Conference of Polish Priests decided to build a new altar. The new altar will retain the same characteristics as the previous one. The old altar has already been demolished, and the new foundations and bench have been poured.

The new altar will be completed in time for this year's celebration of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which will take place on August 9th. It will be consecrated by Archbishop Tadeusz Wojda, President of the Polish Episcopal Conference, who will preside over the main ceremonies in Midland. The total cost of the project is \$80,000. Parishioners who would like to make a donation to build a new Polish altar in Midland can donate directly to the Polish Priests' Conference Credit Union account #98757.
